



Newsela has a free and paid version. The paid version is very robust, and I highly recommend it. However, if your school can't swing it, the free version is still a great resource.











Flipgrid is free and just keeps getting better and better. You need a Google or Microsoft email address to use.










Introducing a New Topic Check for comprehension




Ask students to make predictions about word meanings
